# LMSC 2004 - 2005 TRAVEL TEAM TRYOUT INFORMATION

Each spring, LMSC holds tryouts in the spring for their fall season travel teams. The 2004 - 2005 fall season will feature boys teams and girls teams in age groups from Under 9 up through Under 15.

The number of teams formed in each age group will be dependent on the number of players trying out, as well as the number of qualified coaches that we can identify for that particular age group. There will be a maximum of four teams in each age group.

To be considered for the Travel Team Program, players will be expected to be at all tryout dates for their age group. Each tryout session will last approximately two hours.

Players MUST tryout for the age group corresponding to their birth date, as listed in the tryout schedule, which will be posted on our web page, [www.lmsc.net](http://www.lmsc.net) after March 1st. Players may **NOT** play "UP" in an older age group.

All players will be expected to bring both a white shirt and a dark shirt to all tryouts. Shin guards, soccer shoes and an appropriate sized soccer ball are also required. Under 9 through Under 12 players will need a size 4 ball, U-13 and older will need a size 5 ball.

Players do not need to live in Lower Merion Township to be considered for a travel team, nor do they need to have played in LMSC before. All youngsters of the proper age are welcome to tryout.

All players making one of the LMSC Travel Teams will be expected to attend Travel Team Registration Night which is **TENTATIVELY** set for Thursday, June 3rd.

Tryouts will be held at the following locations:

**Welsh Valley Middle School:** Hagy's Ford Road in Penn Valley, just off of Conshohocken State Rd. (Route 23)

**Bryn Mawr Polo Field:** Old Railroad Avenue and County Line Roads in Bryn Mawr, just south of Lancaster Avenue.

# 2004 LMSC SPRING INTRAMURAL PROGRAM

The Lower Merion Soccer Club is now accepting registrations for their Spring Intramural Program, which will be open to boys and girls born between 1994 and 1999.

Players already in the Travel Team Program are NOT eligible to play in the Spring Intramural Program. Players born before 1994 are also not eligible to play. Children do NOT have to live in Lower Merion Township to participate in the program.

The program will start on Sunday, April 18th and run every Sunday through June 20th, except for Memorial Day Weekend.

**Cost for the season:** For registrations postmarked on or before April 1st, the cost is \$80. The fee for registrations postmarked after April 1 is \$120 (except for the Atoms and Neutrons Divisions which will remain at \$80). Please note that all divisions have limited openings. Once these divisions are filled, we will not be able to take any more players, even if they sign up before April 1.

The different programs that will be offered this spring are listed below. Players are not required to follow the age division guidelines. Parents may select whichever program they feel their child is best suited for. Players may request to switch to a different division during the season if they feel they are in the wrong division. We will make every attempt to accommodate such requests, but cannot guarantee it. The LMSC Directors reserve the right to move a player to a different division if necessary.

Note: Vernon Young Park is located on Greenfield Avenue in Ardmore, about 400 yards down the road from the Mapes Toy Store in Ardmore.

Note: The Field Locations listed above are only TENTATIVE. They are not final and are subject to change.

## FORMATS OF THE DIFFERENT PROGRAMS

**ATOMS, BANTAMS, NEUTRONS and MICRONS** - Each week, players in these age groups will be led through a 20-30 minute skills clinic, led by a member of the LMSC coaching staff. During that time, each child will have his or her own size 3 soccer ball to work with. The primary emphasis of the skills clinic will be for the players to develop soccer skills, as well as develop their coordination and agility as related to the game of soccer.

After each skills clinic, the players will be divided into teams of 6-8 players. Each team will play a 30-40 minute game, playing four players against four. Players in these age groups will NOT be placed on set teams for the year. This is done so that players will be able to enjoy themselves in a non-pressure soccer environment and so that their parents will not have an incentive to worry about having a "winning season", "undefeated season", etc.

All players are strongly encouraged to bring a size 3 soccer ball, with their name clearly written on it in magic marker, to each session. All players will receive an LMSC game shirt at their first practice. As in previous spring seasons, these divisions will play at the Vernon Young Park.

**JUNIORS, INTERMEDIATES, QUASARS AND PROTONS** - Each player in these divisions will be assigned to a team of 13 players for the season. Each team will have its own coach. Each week, the players will meet for 90 minutes. The first 30 minutes will be devoted to working on soccer skills. Each player will be expected to bring a soccer ball (size 3 for Juniors and Quasars, size 4 for Intermediates and Protons) each week. During this 25 minute period, the coach will lead his or her players through various soccer skills work.

This will be followed by a 50 minute soccer game where each team will play against one of the other teams in their division. There will be two simultaneous games of 4 vs. 4, similar to the format used in the Fall Program.

Team records and standings will NOT be kept, there will be no championships and no all star games. The emphasis of the program will be on enjoying the game of soccer itself.

As a courtesy to teammates, coaches and the LMSC program, players in these divisions will need to make a **strong commitment** to being at almost every game during the season (there are no games on Easter Sunday or over Memorial Day Weekend).

Field assignments for these divisions are not yet set. The exact field location for each division will be posted on our web site well before the start of the season.

## OTHER INFORMATION ABOUT THE INTRAMURAL PROGRAM

**EQUIPMENT** - By rule of the United States Soccer Federation, ALL players MUST wear shin guards to games and practices. For safety reasons, soccer shoes are strongly recommended instead of sneakers. Players should wear dark soccer shorts (navy or black) and white soccer socks. These items are available at most sporting goods stores including Sneaky Pete's Discount Sneakers in Ardmore which carries our full line of LMSC items.

**FINANCIAL AID** - Our club is not-for-profit. Its objective is to provide all soccer loving youngsters with a chance to play. Players who are in need of financial assistance in order to play should state this on their registration. One of the goals of LMSC is to not have any child be unable to play soccer due to financial reasons.

**COACHING VOLUNTEERS** - Our program is dependent on having parents of players volunteer as coaches. PLEASE give consideration to volunteering as a coach. We provide head coaches with ample coaching material (both written and video) in order to make the program a success. You do not need to have played the game, you only need to have an interest in working with a small group of children and an ability to stay one or two steps ahead of them in learning the game.

**REFUND POLICY** - Requests for refunds will only be honored through April 1st. There will be a \$20 service charge for refund requests made before then. We will NOT issue refunds for any reason after April 1st.

## HOW TO REGISTER FOR THE LMSC SPRING INTRAMURAL PROGRAM

For registrations postmarked on or before April 1st, the cost is \$80. The fee for registrations postmarked after April 1st is \$120 (except for the Atoms and Neutrons Divisions which will remain at \$80). To register, please fill out a Spring Intramural Registration Form (found on page 9) and mail it, along with your check (payable to LMSC) to: LMSC, Box 469, Gladwyne, PA 19035.

**Atoms, Neutrons, Bantams and Microns Divisions:** Registrations should be received no later than April 1st although we will accept late registrations for these divisions if there are still openings. We will also accept on-site registrations in divisions playing at Vernon Young Park ONLY IF there are still openings in the desired division.

**Juniors, Intermediates, Quasars, Protons, Seniors and Electrons Divisions:** Once a division is filled, we will NOT be able to accept additional registrants, no matter when the registration is received. Be sure to register early, before the division that you requested becomes filled. Our web page will be updated regularly to reflect which divisions still have openings. Since the players in the older divisions will need to be assigned to teams, we will need to receive all registrations by April 1st.

Team assignments, field locations and game times for the older divisions will be posted on our LMSC Web Site on April 10th. All players will need to visit our Web Site ([www.lmsc.net](http://www.lmsc.net)) on or after April 10th for this information. You will **NOT** receive a confirmation notice in the mail.

Players in these divisions may request to be on a team with a maximum of three friends playing in the same division. We will make every effort to honor these requests but we cannot guarantee honoring such requests. Since we make team assignments starting April 1st, we will not be able to honor any car pool / teammate requests for registrations received after that date even if there are still openings in the specified division.

**Team assignments, field locations and game times for the older divisions will be posted on our LMSC Web Site, [www.lmsc.net](http://www.lmsc.net) on April 10th. All players will need to visit our web site on or after April 10th for this information. You will **NOT** receive a confirmation notice in the mail.**

## **SPRING INTRAMURAL REFEREES AND FIELD CREW**

Experienced soccer players ages 11 and up are invited to apply for positions in the Spring Intramural Program as referees and / or field crew workers. You do not need to have prior reffing experience. The program will run on Sunday afternoons starting on April 18th and continue every Sunday through June 20th except for Memorial Day Weekend.

**Level 1 Referees** must be at least 11 years of age with at least two years of playing experience. Level 1 referees will work with our 5 and 6 year old divisions. Referees at these fields will be paid \$10.00 per session (each session lasts 75 minutes).

In addition to reffing games, Level 1 Referees will be expected to help coach the players and teach them the rules of the game as they go along. Referees will be expected to **ACTIVELY** participate in the 20 minute skills clinic at the beginning of each session. They will be expected to work with the program commissioners in teaching the players the fundamental skills of dribbling, passing, receiving, shooting, goalkeeping, etc.

Referees will be expected to help with field setup and to help put equipment away at the end of the day.

**Level 2 Referees** will be responsible for officiating the 7-10 year old divisions. To qualify as a Level 2 Referee, you must be at least 13 years of age OR be 11 years of age and have at least two seasons of reffing experience. Games will be played at Belmont Hills Elementary School, Welsh Valley Middle School and Haverford College. We will need several Level 2 Referees each Sunday to each do two to four games each. They will be paid \$12 per game. Each game lasts one hour.

Each Thursday, the LMSC Referee Assignor will call referees until enough referees have been identified to cover all games for the upcoming Sunday. If called, you will need to let the Referee Assignor know if you are available to work that weekend. There is no penalty for not being available to referee. If you do commit to reffing and then fail to show up, you will be removed from the referee list for the remainder of the season and all of the Fall Intramural Season.

All referees will be expected to wear soccer attire including a soccer tee shirt, soccer flats and soccer shorts. Basketball sneakers, heavy metal tee shirts, etc. will not be tolerated. Referees will be expected to provide their own whistle each time that they referee.

**Field Crew** workers will be responsible for setting up the goals, taking down the goals, loading and unloading equipment, etc. Field crew workers will also be responsible for lining the fields. Field Crew workers must be at least 13 years of age. They will be paid \$12 per hour.

# 2004 SUMMER SOCCER CAMPS

## INTRAMURAL CAMPS AND TRAVEL TEAM CAMPS

LMSC is now accepting registrations for their 14th Annual Summer Soccer Camps. The LMSC Summer Soccer Camps will offer four different programs in June. There will be an evening travel team camp held both weeks. The second week will also feature an intramural camp from 8:30 AM - 12:30 PM. The travel team camp will be geared towards advanced players. Advanced technical skills and tactical work will be stressed at these camps. Small sided games will be played at the end of each session.

The highly popular PeeWees program will return. This 90 minute per day program is open to 3 and 4 year olds.

There will be seven separate camps offered this summer:

The Summer camps are tentatively set to again be held at Harriton High School (Ithan Avenue in Rosemont). The Fall Pre-Season Travel Team Camps are tentatively set to be held at Amherst Playground in Bala Cynwyd.

**The Summer Travel Team Camps** will run from 4:00 PM until 8:00 PM each day. These camps will only be open to players playing in the LMSC Travel Team Program. Intramural players and non-LMSC travel team players will not be accepted into these camps. The camps will focus on more advanced technical and tactical training. Skill development and tactical field awareness will be the top priority at these advanced camps. Each camper will receive an LMSC Summer Soccer Camp tee-shirt as well as a camp soccer ball.

**The Intramural Camp** will run from 8:30 AM until 12:30 PM each day. The first part of each session will focus on individual skill development and small group tactics. Players will spend a significant amount of time with their own soccer ball, developing their technical skills. The second part of each session will focus on small sided games where the children will learn to apply their skills in game situations. Each camper will receive an LMSC Summer Soccer Camp tee-shirt as well as a camp soccer ball.

**PeeWees Soccer Camp** - LMSC will again run a special 90 minute per day PeeWees camp for 3 and 4 year olds. The emphasis of this camp will be on teaching the basic skills of the game to youngsters as well as learning to enjoy the game of soccer. Our staff will offer a variety of fun soccer activities to the players, all with the primary emphasis of having a "fun-filled experience in a soccer environment." Please note that this camp will only be run on the second week of our June camps.

**Fall Pre-Season Travel Team Camps:** LMSC will again run their Pre-Season Travel Team camps before Labor Day. These camps will ONLY be open to LMSC travel team players. Non-LMSC players, and non-travel team players will not be accepted to this camp.

**How To Register** - The cost of each of the above camps is \$140, except for the PeeWees camp which is \$80. Checks may be made out to the Lower Merion Soccer Club. The registration form (found on page 13 of this newsletter) and check should be mailed to: LMSC, Box 469, Gladwyne, PA 19035. Registrations for the summer camps should be received by June 5th at the latest. Registrations for the fall camps should be received no later than August 1st.

## SPECTATOR CONDUCT AT YOUTH SOCCER EVENTS

This winter we had not one, but two incidents of LMSC parents consuming alcohol at indoor soccer events. In one instance, the organization governing the soccer event politely asked the adults involved in this to stop. According to the tournament organizers, the parents became quite nasty about this.

As a result, our State Association has strongly asked us to communicate to the parents of ALL of our players that the consumption of alcohol is prohibited at all youth soccer games, whether they be indoor games or outdoor games. Parents and other adult spectators are strongly asked to try to be positive role models at games. We are asking parents and adult spectators to be positive role models not only for their children, but for the other children (LMSC players or opponents) at the games.

Over the past few years, LMSC has strongly asked all parents to not verbally abuse referees and to never yell at the players in the games (regardless of if the players are LMSC players, opposing players or your child). We now are asking parents and spectators to PLEASE not consume alcohol at games and to not smoke near the athletes who are working hard at the sport they love. Our thanks to everyone in advance for your cooperation.

## UPCOMING YOUTH SOCCER COACHING COURSES

This spring, LMSC will be offering the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) Regional Diploma Coaching Course. The Course is 13 hours long and is HIGHLY recommended for all intramural coaches. The course is tentatively set to run on Monday evenings, April 12, 19 and 26 and also on Saturday Morning, May 1st. No prior coaching background is required and no prior soccer playing experience is needed.

The more advanced United States Soccer Federation 'D' level coaching course will be offered in the spring. This is a 36 hour coaching course that will be held over many evenings. It is highly recommended for head coaches in the Travel Team Program.

Each year our travel teams Under 11 and older are eligible to compete in both the Indoor State Cups and the Outdoor State Cups. Since 1989, LMSC has had 45 teams reach the semifinals of State Cups. 14 of those 45 teams have been crowned State Champions.

In 2003, the Under 12 boys LMSC Hammerheads won the State Championship, then won the Region One USA Championship, a competition for the 15 state champions from Maine through West Virginia. The Hammerheads won both the Indoor and Outdoor State Championships in both 2002 and 2003. The only other LMSC team to accomplish this was in 1990 when the Under 13 Gorillas won both the cup competitions in the same season.
